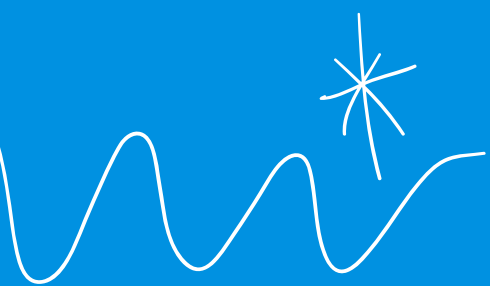

WHAT IS AVOIDANCE CULTURE?

Avoidance culture is a pattern of dodging difficult or emotionally charged conversations—especially at leadership levels.

IT SHOWS UP AS:

- 1 Sugarcoated or vague feedback
- 2 Avoiding underperformance issues
- 3 “Nice” meetings with no resolution
- 4 Withholding truths from team, board, and partners
- 3 Chronic overwork that avoids strategic confrontation

The ripple effects: confusion, mistrust, missed goals, team turnover.

Avoidance doesn't protect culture—it erodes it.

POOR COMMUNICATION & FINANCIAL LOSSES

While tech innovation grabs headlines, a quieter—and costlier—crisis is unfolding inside our teams: **unresolved workplace conflict**.

- Employees spend **2.8 hours per week** managing workplace conflict instead of focusing on core responsibilities
- That's over **\$350 billion** in lost productivity across U.S. companies each year
- Conflict-related absenteeism costs **\$3,600 per employee** annually
- Nearly **50% of employee departures** are tied to workplace disputes

It's about being more present, more honest, and more aligned—even when it's hard.

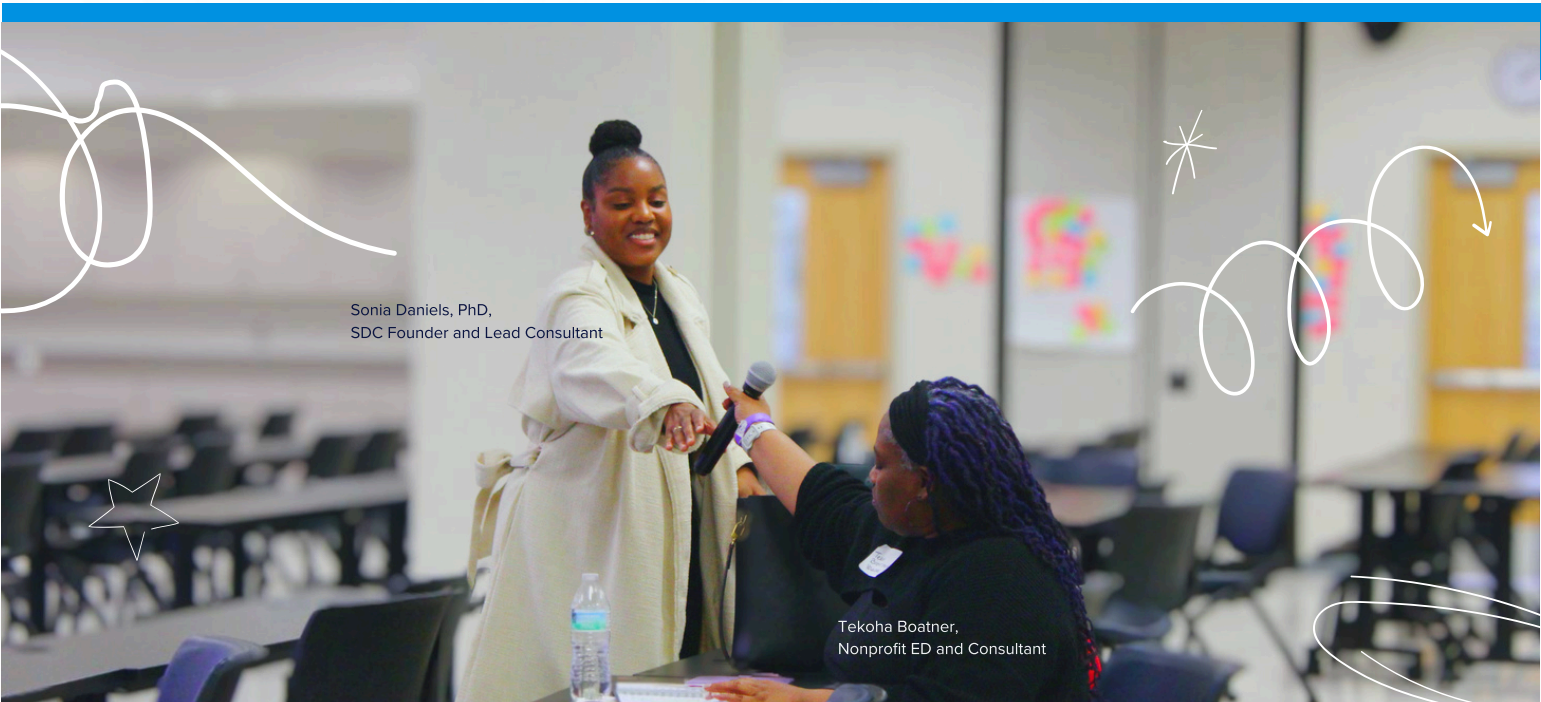
6 CORE AREAS OF WORKPLACE AVOIDANCE

3 MINDSET SHIFTS

Here are three simple but powerful mindset shifts that directly improve trust, talent retention, and revenue by addressing avoidance culture:

FROM “AVOID CONFLICT” → “ADDRESS EARLY WITH CURIOSITY”

Why it matters: Avoiding tough conversations erodes trust, fuels resentment, and drives turnover.

Shift impact: Builds psychological safety, strengthens communication, and prevents issues from escalating into costly problems.

FROM “FEEDBACK IS CONFRONTATION” → “FEEDBACK IS CLARITY”

Why it matters: Many leaders fear giving feedback because they equate it with judgment or conflict.

Shift impact: When feedback is seen as a tool for growth and clarity, teams stay aligned, performance improves, and retention strengthens.

FROM “CULTURE IS HR’S JOB” → “CULTURE IS HOW WE LEAD DAILY”

Why it matters: When leaders outsource culture, it becomes performative.

Shift impact: Embedding accountability and belonging into daily leadership builds trust, boosts morale, and drives meaningful, sustained results.
